A BYLAW TO REGULATE TRAFFIC IN THE TOWN OF LANIGAN

The Council of the Town of Lanigan in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

SHORT TITLE

This Bylaw may be cited as The Traffic Bylaw

APPLICATION

That all of the provisions and enactments set forth in this Bylaw shall relate to, and be in full force and effect within the limits of the Town of Lanigan.

47. HEAVY VEHICLE ROUTE

- (1) No person shall drive a heavy vehicle on any street or portion of a street except on those streets set out in Schedule F attached hereto and forming part of this Bylaw. The streets or portions thereof as set out in Schedule F are hereby established as heavy vehicle routes






